AB 2346 (GABRIEL) OUTDOOR RECREATION: EQUITABLE ACCESS GRANT PROGRAM

This legislation creates the Equitable Access Grant Program to enhance park access for all ages and develop career pathways outdoors.

In committee: Held under submission

AB 2975 (COMMITTEE ON WATER, PARKS, AND WILDLIFE)

Would establish a community access pilot program for nonprofits that provide programs and services for communities with barriers to accessing state parks and beaches.

Passed Assembly, Senate in committee: Held under submission

Reintroduced as AB 1150, signed into law in 2023

AB 2128 (COOLEY) STATE PARKS: CALIFORNIA ADMISSION DAY: DISCOUNTED ADMISSION

This legislation creates a 50% discount upon entry to California State Parks for California Admission Day.

In committee: Held under submission

AB 2146 (BAUER-KAHAN) NEONICOTINOID PESTICIDES: PROHIBITED NONAGRICULTURAL USE

This legislation protects pollinators, like western monarch butterflies, by banning the sales, use, or possession of neonicotinoid pesticides in California for nonagricultural uses.

Vetoed

Reintroduced as AB 363, signed into law in 2023

SB 867 (LAIRD) SEA LEVEL RISE PLANNING: DATABASE

Continues the important work of the sea level planning database by extending the database's use to 2028.

Vetoed

Reintroduced as SB 272, signed into law in 2023

AB 1789 (BENNETT) OUTDOOR RECREATION: CALIFORNIA TRAILS COMMISSION: TRAILS CORPS PROGRAM: GRANT PROGRAM

Requires California State
Parks to update their
statewide California
Recreation Trails System
Plan by January 2024 and
report to the Legislature on
progress in implementing
the plan to enhance and
expand trail networks
across the state.

Signed into law in 2022



AB 30 (KALRA) PARKS: ACCESS TO NATURE BY ASSEMBLYMEMBER ASH KALRA OF SAN JOSE

This bill makes it the policy of the state of California that all Californians have safe and affordable access to nature and access to the benefits of nature when making budget and infrastructure decisions.

Signed into law in 2022
